The names of this year's recipients of the L'Oréal Malaysia 'For Women in Science' National Fellowships will be announced at a ceremony to be held at Carcosa Seri Negara on Oct 30

The financial aid was introduced in Malaysia in 2006 with the support of the Malaysian National Commission for Unesco, and in partnership with the Academy of Sciences Malaysia, the Science, Technology and Innovation Ministry, and the (then) Higher Education

In recognition of the contribution of lalaysian women in the nation's scientific progress, the awards aim to support their sci-entific research and highlight their significance in the field of research work done in Malaysia.

The jury panel, made up of representatives from these supporting institutions, was presided by Professor Dr. Jalani Sukaimi, FASc – Dean for the Faculty of Science & Technology of Kolej University Islam Malaysia.
