FIFTEEN students received their welldeserved ticket to further studies when they were presented with the 8TV Scholarship Fund last Monday.

8TV chief executive officer Ahmad Izham Omar, who presented the students with the awards, explained the basis on which the recipients were selected.

"Good academic results is an important factor, but what is more important is their extra-curricular activities and how well-rounded the students are overall, because we are looking for potential leaders," he said

Ahmad Izham advised students to always follow their heart when

choosing their field of study, instead of letting others select the courses for them.
