It was nice to see the way in which the atmosphere that had been engendered over the preceding weeks, in which the students clearly felt at home and at ease in the lab, was paying off.

Of course the academic staff had also been busy over the preceding days, planning ahead, to make sure the various display specimens and equipment would be in place. The multimedia projection facilities, CCD camera and 'pots' of prosected specimens were as good as anything at home.

This was clearly a joint effort between staff and willing students - and that impressed me. Organisation would have been more rigid back in Nottingham, with less student participation, and I really liked the palpable sense of community associated with this visit.

'Do you think he liked it?' It hardly seemed that a moment had passed before the Minister and his entourage, having toured the lab, were off elsewhere. He could hardly fail to have been impressed. I was!
