UPMKB team's Nanning trip highlights focus on agro-vocational education

BINTULU: The technical and vocational education and training (TVET) education has always been a key agenda in national education, as a viable platform to produce highly-skilled workers, in line with the needs in the increasingly-evolving economy.

In this aspect, Universiti Putra Malaysia Bintulu Campus (UPMKB) through its Faculty of Humanities, Management and Science, recently arranged a visit to Nanning in Guangxi, as an effort to further drive innovation in agricultural vocational education.

"These discussions not only focused on vocational education in Nanning, but also opened opportunities for us to present Malaysia as a good destination for their students to pursue post-graduate education," said Dr Wong in a statement.

The universities visited by the UPMKB representatives were Guangxi Vocational University of Agriculture, Nanning Vocational and Technical University (NVTU), Nanning University, Guangxi Minzu University, and Guangxi University of Finance and Economics (GXUFE).

It is informed that these universities in Nanning started out as vocational IPTs before evolving into key institutions offering a wide range of comprehensive undergraduate and postgraduate programmes.

In addition, the UPMKB delegation also held discussions highlighting short-term mobility

programmes that would enhance UPMKB's visibility.

"These programmes are expected to provide opportunities to the students and staff in gaining international experience and expanding their professional networks.

"The UPMKB consistently supports efforts to drive collaboration between international IPTs to support Sarawak's aspiration of becoming a globally respected hub for higher education," said Wong.
