## Seminar out to educate Tatau folk about aquaponics business opportunities

BINTULU: Over 100 participants in Tatau took part in the Aquaponics Entrepreneurship seminar, which was recently held at SK Sungai Bagian.

The participants comprised residents from Rumah Ulen Segaya, Rumah Banyang Rekan, Rumah Abong Medan, Rumah Josip Adam, Rumah Rundi Layau, Rumah Gundi Chunggat, Rumah Enjan Gos, Rumah Dora Lani, as well as teachers, staff and students from SK Sungai Bagian.

Organised by Universiti Putra Malaysia Bintulu Sarawak Campus (UPMKB) through the Community Empowerment Programme@UniMadani Grant from the Finance Ministry, the event aimed to educate the local community on business opportunities in aquaponics, which combines plant cultivation

with fish farming.
