100m-long sandwich a record feat

PUTRAJAYA: The Fisheries Department has made its mark in the *Malaysia Book of Records* by creating a 100m-long tuna sandwich formation, titled "100 Years Maha 2024" in conjunction with Malaysian Agriculture, Horiculture and Agrotourism's (Maha) 100th anniversary.

In a statement, Agriculture and Food Security Minister Datuk Seri Mohamad Sabu said this unique sandwich formation, the first of its kind in Malaysia, was accomplished in partnership with the Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) Faculty of Food Science and Technology.

The tuna sandwich was prepared by UPM students and staff, alongside the department's personnel.

The sandwiches are distributed for free to visitors at the Fisheries Pavilion during the exhibition at Malaysia Agro Exposition Park Serdang (MAEPS).

Mohamad also released 100 indigenous fish worth RM13,000 into the MAEPS lake.
