## **SLIM HOPES:** Absence of top trio could dampen gold prospects

DEPLETED five-member diving team will be counted on for medals in the ongoing Asian Aquatics Championships in Dubai after Malaysia returned empty-handed from the just concluded swimming and synchronised swimming competitions.

With the absence of Olympic bronze medallist Pandelela Rinong, Leong Mun Yee and Bryan Nickson Lomas, the team, led by Sea Games champion Cheong Jun Hoong, only have a medal chance in the women's 3-metre springboard individual discipline as China and Japan have registered their best divers.

Wendy Ng, Loh Zhiayi, Ooi Tze Liang and Chew Yiwei make up the squad for the event which starts on Thursday.

Zhiayi, 15, who specialises in women's platform, wants to make an impact on her first major tournament in Dubai.

The debutante was only selected to fill the void left by an injured Pandelela, and Traisy Vivien Tukiet, who is sitting for exams.

Zhiayi, a back-up member for the 2016 Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, has been making steady progress in junior competitions. She finished fifth in the girls' platform Group B (14-15) final at last month's World Junior Championships in Adelaide and also won two gold for Federal Territories at the Malaysia Games in Kuantan in June.

But the Asian meet will offer a tougher contest for Zhiayi as she will face world class divers from China, North Korea and Japan.

China are unlikely to field Olympic champion Chen Ruolin but are still sending national team divers and should have no problem doing what is expected of them.

"My degree of difficulty is still low. I am here to gain experience. I am aware competing at the senior level is so much different than the junior," said Zhiayi in Dubai yesterday.

"But the coach told me to treat it just like any competition. I have been training hard after the world junior meet, so I am really looking forward to the competition.

"It's only my second senior appearance after a fruitful outing at

the Sea Aquatic Championships in Singapore in June."

Meanwhile, the three-member swimming squad failed to win a medal against a world class field in Dubai but Olympian Khoo Cai Lin and Kevin Yeap made the nation proud by earning two quota spots each for next year's World Championships in Spain.

Cai Lin did not record a good time in the women's freestyle final but her 4:17.88 gave her fifth placing on Saturday. She also surpassed the world meet qualifying time of 4:18.55.

It was enough for the Cai Lin to earn a second quota spot after achieving her first in the 800m freestyle at the London Olympics. She swam a commendable 8:49.96 to finish fourth in the 800m final on Sunday.

Kevin dipped below the world meet qualifying time in the men's 400m and 1,500m freestyle events.

In synchronised swimming, the Lee sisters — Zyanne and Zylane — finished fifth in free duet with 73.650 points. Olympic bronze medallists China won the competition with 94.210 points.

## Lauretta takes centrestage

**THE** honours among the boys were evenly spread, while national junior Lauretta Eva Adrian remained a dominant force among the girls in the second leg of the SportExcel National Junior Circuit (Track) at the Kuala Lumpur Velodrome over the weekend.

Amid more calls for the country's first indoor velodrome's construction to be speeded up — rain disrupted events on Friday and Saturday, while length of events held on Sunday had to be shortened — Pelapis rider Lauretta featured in all four under-18 girls' finals.

The Sabah-born Lauretta won the 200m sprint, 500m time trial and scratch race, but had to settle for second in the 2km individual pursuit won by fellow Pelapis rider Nurul Nadia Mohd Fauzi.

The new breed of Perak riders did provide an eye-opener as they battled the Pelapis riders in the under-18 boys' races.

Mohd Zawawi Azman was a name worth noting, as he took Pelapis rider Syafiq Shazwan Zainuddin to three heats in the 200m sprint final, before losing and almost took a surprise victory in the 1km time trial.

Zawawi clocked one minute 15.561 seconds in the 1km time trial to settle for second with Syafiq Shazwan taking the win by the skin of his teeth with a time of 1:15.228s. Zawawi also got on the podium with a second place in the scratch race and third in the individual pursuit.
