First champions in tourney

UTM emerge as winners of inaugural netball league

NIVERSITI Teknologi Malaysia (UTM) became the inaugural champions of the Higher Education Ministry (IPT) Netball League when they defeated Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) 38-26 in the final at the UM Sports Centre in Kuala Lumpur recently.

It was a close match as both UTM and UPM had several internationals on their side. But UTM, under the guidance of Nur Ezzaini Mohd Nor, were impressive in the counterattack and collected the points.

Nur Ezzaini, who was also the coach, had excellent support from internationals Fazira Mesnan and Nur Shafiqin Mustafa, and did not allow UPM, who had international Puah Pei San in attack, any chance to fight back.

Nur Ezzaini, a final year Sports Science student, said they were proud to be the first champions in

the tournament.

"We had trained for almost three months. We have to commend all the players for their determination throughout the season. The final was a close match but we managed to take the lead and maintained it until the end," said an excited Nur Ezzaini.

UTM qualified for the final after beating favourites Universiti Malaya 30-24 in the semi-finals while UPM

upstaged UiTM 27-22.

Nur Ezzaini said the semi-final match against Universiti Malaya was

an interesting one.

"UM also had several internationals. It was a tough match and our players rose to the occasion to win. The victory also gave us the confidence to take on UPM. The instructions was to play a fast and attacking game. It worked and we have become the champions," said the 25-year-old Nur Ezzaini, a former student of Bukit Jalil Sports School (BJSS).

As the champions, UTM received RM5,000 and the challenge trophy while UPM settled for RM3,000. UITM finished third after a 34-21 win over UM. UITM received

RM2,000 and UM RM1,000.

UM's Lim Mun Yee was voted as the Most Promising Player; UTM's Fazira was named as the Best Defender; the Best Player award went to UiTM's Rozliana Mohd

Ridzuan while UPM's Nur Ain Omar won the Top Scorer award.

The grand finals was a culmination of a four-zone circuit initiated by UM. After the zone level competition, the top four teams from each zone qualified for the grand finals.
