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Father of modern road safety

His many other firsts included leading the Miros crash investigation team and driving other programmes such as the first instrumented car to test driver aptitude, the new curriculum for drivers and other initiatives, including seatbelts, helmets, visibility and rear under-run for lorries. Radin has not only been the towering personalty in road safety but a towering Malaysian with the highest integrity, professionalism and ideals. A true friend always. Reply: Radin, 53, died of liver cancer at the Serdang Hospital at 4.15am last Sunday. The former director-general of the Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (Miros) and Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) vice-chancellor had been battling with the killer disease for the past four years. He was a strong believer in road safety research, invention and initiative, and widely regarded as the father of modern road safety in Malaysia. Radin also headed 14 research projects and produced over 100 journal publications of high impact, apart from receiving 22 awards and recognition both locally and overseas.
