Tough task for Shin Yii

NG Shin Yii must show she is ready to step up and fill the vacuum created by the retirement of two-time Asian Games champion Chai Fong Ying in women's taijijian (taiji sword) and taijiquan at the World Championships, which start today.

Fong Ying, a three-time world champion, quit the sport in June citing injury and studies as her main reasons.

Shin Yii, a third-year student in business administration at Universiti Putra Malaysia, deferred her studies for seven weeks to prepare for the world meet and the 24-year-old hopes her sacrifice will pay dividends.

"I will do my best to make an impact in the competition. I had to defer my studies due to training commitments in China. My coach told me to focus on the world meet," said Shin Yii at KLBA Stadium in Cheras yesterday.

"Everyone is expecting me to emulate Fong Ying's success in the sport. I will try my best but competition is going to be tough. I am, however, well-prepared for the challenge," said the two-time Sea Games silver medallist.
