Food industry players need to understand security concerns

FOOD security refers. In the Economist Intelligence Unit's 2015 Global Food Security Index, Malaysia is placed at 34th out of 109 countries, but was far behind Singapore, ranked second-most food secure country in the world. It is timely that the agenda of
