

NIVERSITY of Malaya Chinese Orchestra (Umco) did justice to joyful traditional Chinese music at their recently concluded annual concert.

Themed "A Storm of Stars" the concept was based on the fact that each musician possesses his own uniqueness when paired with an instrument.

However, as an orchestra, the musicians have the ability to weave tales and tell stories with their exquisite music and sweet harmonies. The highlight of the night was the encore piece which was recomposed by conductor Ho Kye Wenn.

The chairman of the concert, Koo Xuan Yi, who has been involved in Chinese orchestra since his secondary school days, said that the members had put in six months of practice in preparation for the concert.
