The duration of the entire course is five years.

The first two and a half years of the course focuses on pre-clinical studies or theoretical knowledge, covering topics such as veterinary anatomy, histology, physiology, neuroscience, microbiology, animal health and welfare, pathology, parasitology, introductory personal and professional skills for veteri-

narians and principles of animal management.

From this theoretical foundation, students will segue into clinical studies for their final years, which will include rotations covering a wide variety of animals.

The education syllabus in these universities is compact and is as good as any other established universities in any other part of the world.

Yet, the tuition fees are much cheaper and the cost of living is affordable.
