DATO' SRI DR. HJ. ABD. RAHMAN BIN HJ. ABD. RAHIM Director-General of Forestry, Peninsular Malaysia

Could you briefly provide us your personal, family and academic background?

Dato' Prof. Dr. Hj. Abd. Rahman was born on 2 March 1957 as the 10th among his siblings of Javanese descendants. His first education was in his hometown, Sekolah Kebangsaan Temoh. Temoh is a small town in the Batang Padang district of Perak, Malaysia. The town is located midway between Kampar and Tapah. His secondary study was in Sekolah Menengah Tapah (Government English Secondary School, GESS). He was a head boy in his school and actively involved with students activities. His favourite food is Laksa Penang.

In 1977, he started his first degree in Bachelor of Forestry at the Faculty of Forestry, Universiti Putra Malaysia. During his student days, he was very active in student unions in his Fifth College and also in campus. His final year project was supervised by Prof. Dr. Khamis Awang and Prof Dr. Lim Meng Tsai. He got married in 1982 with a former UPM student after he graduated. He was granted him with 3 children. Then he pursue his Master degree in Forestry (MSc) under the supervision of Prof. Dr. Yusuf Hadi and Prof. Dr. Awang Nor Abdul Ghani in 1987. His PhD is in Operational Research in Forestry from Aberdeen University in Scotland, United Kingdom in 1998. His specializations include forestry policy and development, silviculture, forest management, forest plantation and forest law enforcement. In UK, he was president of Nusantara (student society) at Aberdeen.

What make you really love with your work now, and what is your philosophy in managing the organisation?

As a trained graduate in Forestry, his main passion is on Tropical Rain Forest and environment. Tropical Rain Forest is very diverse and unique as it has contributed a lot to the livelihood of the world community. He is really proud to be a forester. He was the person who started the development information system E-FORGRIS for FDPM. In this regards, he wants all forestry personnel to



engage and commit in "an excellent working culture" by eliminating negative attitudes, implement positives attitude and continue to deliver the best service consistently.

What are the secrets that motivate you to be a successful person?

We need to have a vision and always be positive. Rasullullah S.A.W should be our role model. We should have a mental and spiritual strength. He has 30 years of working experience with the Forestry Department of Peninsular Malaysia and served in various positions including as Assistant State Forestry Director, Negeri Sembilan & Melaka, Director of Forest Plantation, Forestry Department Headquarters Peninsular Malaysia and Johor State Forestry Director and Deputy Director-General (Policy & Planning), Forestry Department of Peninsular Malaysia. He is currently the Director-General of Forestry of Peninsular Malaysia.

His vast knowledge in forestry enables him to work closely with various local agencies and organizations. In pursuant to his active involvement and contributions to the forestry projects particularly in National Coastal Protection Program in Malaysia, he has been appointed as Adjunct Professor at the Malaysia University of Terengganu (UMT), Malaysia for 2012-2013.



In the international arena, he has been actively involved in various regional and international activities related to forestry, including Chairman of Expert Panel to "ITTO Expert Panel for Project/Pre-project Appraisal and Evaluation", (1999-2000), Co-Chairman of the Committee on Reforestation and Forest Management (RFM) under the ITTC (2011), Co-Chairman of the Asia-Pacific Forestry Commission (APFC, 2012) and the Chairman of APEC Expert Group on Illegal Logging and Associate Trade for 2012-2013.

The existence of FDPM is about 110 years. We have the responsibility to ensure that FDPM will continue to play its role to be the agency of excellence in the sustainable management of tropical forest in tandem with the Government's Transformation Program (GTP).

The staff must be strongly equipped with vast knowledge, organisational skills and integrity. He introduced "bahtera hijau" concept where all the staff members must work together as a team.

How far is the progress in making foresters as a professional in Malaysia?

Faculty of Forestry is the only who produces profesional forester. The Bachelor of Forestry programme must be updated with new areas with regards to forestry, biodiversity and environment. The meeting with stakeholders can improve it. The introduction of Institute of Foresters Malaysia (IRIM) is where we can find professional foresters from both public and private sectors. It mantains and improves standard of practice and professionalism of



Do you believe UPM can play a major role in the development and progress of forestry programme in country?

Most of the FDPM staff are alumni from Faculty of Forestry. So UPM, plays important roles in producing graduates, not only with forestry knowledge but with good analytical and critical thinking skills. They have the opportunity to specialise in smallor large-scale plantations, restoration forestry, provision of environmental services, wood utilisation, forest inventory and international forestry.


Which part of the Campus or person (s) within UPM you really missed and why?

His welcoming speech during UPM International Alumni Seminar and Bridges-Link Alumni Centre UPM and Universitas Andalas, Padang, Sumatra on 16-21 November 2016 was spiced with humour, interesting anecdotes and regularly interjected with Malay 'pantuns' (poetic lyrics) which has become his trademark as a speaker. This did not belie the fact that, he is an extraordinary man with an extraordinary energy who is a hardworking politician, a prolific writer, an intense sports enthusiast, a well-known religious teacher, a popular lecturer, an efficient administrator, a music lover and at a the same time a dedicated family man.

As a Governor of West Sumatra (2010-2021), he mentioned how the human resource knowledge he gained in UPM helped him in becoming an excellent administrator. He earned a Master's degree in Human Resource Development and PhD degree in

Training and Management from UPM between the years 1995 to 2000. Based on his training, he developed four main areas in his administration leadership which are as follows: selection and recruitment; mutation and rotation; placing and promotion and training and development. He has to administer a staff of 23,000 strong. He recognised that every individual is not the same and should be allotted his roles according to his abilities and personality. Thus, he developed a unique assessment system in analysing the selection and performance of his staff. He put forward also a system of rotation to develop his staff and also to discover their strengths and weaknesses in their jobs. He also established a training system where they are trained systematically.

As a Professor (2008 - now), which he obtained from Universitas Muhammadiyah Jakarta (UMJ), he paid tributes to the professors

and lecturers in UPM who had contributed in shaping him up to what he is today. He had a special mention of Professor Azemi who had trained him as an effective writer while doing his PhD in UPM. To date he has written 40 books, 350 articles and 8,800 'pantun'. He not only gave academic lectures but also religious talks, despite of not being trained in the religious areas. His training in UPM had guided him in training his students as excellent scholars, particularly in the areas of academic research of international repute. According to him anyone can succeed in whatever he is doing, provided he has a strong passion and interest on it.

He ventured into national politics between 1999-2010 and won three successive national elections as Member of Parliament. This culminated in his winning two terms, as Governor of West Sumatra: the first was for the period 2010-2015



and the second was for the period 2016-2021. As a politician he has to galvanise support from the various sections of society, such as farmers, fishermen, labourers, businessmen, intellectuals, professionals and government servants. He stated that without any doubt that his training in UPM which developed his ability to communicate and understand the various facets of human characters helped him immeasurably in undertaking his job as a politician. He was able to feel the pulse of his people and delivered their needs effectively.

His crowned achievement is that he has established and managed an Education Board which is called Adzkia in Padang, West Sumatera in 1988. This education entity is still active until today. It has









a Children Kindergarten (Taman Kanak-Kanak -TK), Primary School (Sekolah Dasar -SD), First Secondary School (Sekolah Menengah Pertama -SMP), Engineering Secondary School (Sekolah Menengah Kejuruteraan -SMK), and Higher Teacher Training (Perguruan Tinggi) . More than 5000 undergraduates and graduates are managed by Adzkia.

As a whole, Professor Dr. H. Irwan Prayitno believes in education that can elevate a person's standing in life. Being largely an academician and from an academic parents, he also instilled in his 10 children to be academicians. One might ask how did Professor Irwan manage his multitude of activities at the same time? His message was simple: Plan your work and work your plan. This discipline he acquired from UPM, which had propelled him to succeed in all his endeavours. Lastly, UPM had also provided him the spiritual light to comprehend and practise the teachings of Islam.

ossessing an educational background in agriculture, is not an obstacle for Tuan Haji Laili Ismail to start a career in a transportation field namely an express bus company. Now he s the Managing Director of Tiara Pesona and Chief Executive Officer of Ekspres Perdana. Ekspres Perdana began its operations seven years ago. In December 2016, it received the Best Operator for Bus Express Category Award by Land Public Transport Commission (SPAD), Malaysia. Obviously, this recognition gives a boost to the management and staff to remain efficient and competitive in order to provide the best service to users in the country.





Now, Ekspres Perdana has invested about RM60 million to buy 62 express buses within six years to strengthen the public transport operations that is provided by the company.

"Prior to work in this field, I was a contractor. I guess my prayers every night so I can do business in areas other than construction finally granted by God", he said. Determined to

be serious in the land transport business, he and his wife, who was a teacher, willing to guit her work to focus entirely on this company.

No foundation, no experience or unskilled is no excuse for not trying. Fear of failure is usually the reason to avoid making changes in yourself. To Haji Laili, a person will fail if he refuses to change

and does not want to accept the current changes. Therefore he adds, Ekspres Perdana will make a difference by changing the logo and body design of the new bus in line with the latest technological developments. With the theme of "Bas Warna Warni, Plat Ribu-ribu", he believes this change could attract the attention of users/consumers.

I need to ensure all drivers have a good track record in their work, diligent and not slacking off. 



THE NATIONAL COCONUT WORKSHOP 2016

UPM Alumni Association (PAUPM) in collaboration with the Faculty of Agriculture organised the National Coconut Workshop 2016. The event was officiated by YB. Dato' Sri Ahmad Shabery Cheek, Minister of Agriculture and Agro-based Industry (MOA). The objectives of the workshop, among others, were to share updates on the development of coconut industry in Malaysia, to assist the Government and related agencies in the implementation of policies to achieve further growth and expansion and to discuss strategies towards forming an interactive platform for the benefits of stake holders in Malaysia. MOA and its agencies such as the Malaysian Agriculture Research and

Development Institute (MARDI), the Federal Agriculture Marketing Authority (FAMA) and the Department of Agriculture (DOA) gave their full cooperation by becoming co-organisers as well as members of the Organising Committee, whilst LINACO Manufacturing Sdn Berhad agreed to be the main sponsor for the Workshop.
