Meanwhile, KiplePay chief executive officer Tan Kay Yen said the collaboration with Bank Islam brings forth cashless integration within the KiplePay app and Bank Islam payment services.

"This programme is just the beginning as more initiatives will be introduced in the future.

"Our innovative solutions stem

from continuous learning, on ground tests as well as through understanding the specific needs of our communities," he said, adding that through this initiative they aim to create a robust and holistic ecosystem that promotes the digital lifestyle.

Bank Islam and KiplePay are looking to make this programme available to 50% of campuses in the country and aiming for a wider reach after more features are added.

"Each university student will be logged into a different interface based on their university's identification number.

"Apart from students, other users can still enjoy the benefits from this application for both Android and Apple's IoS operating system
