The Universiti Putra Malaysia student said there was no physical

contact when he reached his home in Kulim at the break of dawn.

"I make it a point to maintain a safe distance from my family members.

"This is not easy as I have four nephews and nieces," he said, adding that young children were affectionate and love to be hugged. Fahmi also said that it had been some time since he last tasted his mother's cooking.

Azizah Darus made his favourite ayam masak kicap (soy sauce chicken) for breaking of fast.

Azizah said she was very grateful that her son had a safe journey home.
