

RM13mil raised to fund five Covid-19 relief projects for hospitals, frontliners and the needy > 13

RM13mil raised for pandemic relief projects

YAYASAN Nanyang Press and other contributors raised RM13mil for five Covid-19 relief projects to support hospitals, frontliners and the underprivileged community.

The efforts provided for Covid-19 test kits, meals for frontliners, personal protective equipment (PPE) for frontliners, face masks for the underprivileged and daily meals for the B40 group affected by the pandemic.

The projects were made possible thanks to contributions by an anonymous donor (RM4mil), Yayasan Nanyang Press (RM2.1mil), Yayasan Kebajikan Komuniti Malaysia, Genting Berhad (RM1.83mil), China Press Charity Home (RM1mil), Tan Sri Lee Loy Seng Foundation (RM1mil), Kuala Lumpur Kepong Berhad (RM500,000) and Golden Eagle Reality Sdn Bhd (20,000 pieces of face masks).

With assistance from
Test4Malaysia, a total of RM11.4mil
was used to purchase 156,200
reverse transcriptase-polymerase
chain reaction (RT-PCR) Covid-19
diagnostic kits, 30,000 swabs,
10,000 vials of viral transport
media, 235,000 sample collection
packs and 64,600 RNA extraction
kits for government hospitals as
well as public health and university laboratories.

The foundation also provided 5,720 meals to 260 healthcare professionals at Hospital Tengku Ampuan Rahimah Klang and Institute of Medical Research (IMR) as well as dry food for the frontliners at Hospital Kuala Lumpur (HKL) and IMR.

A total of 5,150 pieces of PPE suits, 10,000 face shields and 32,000 disposable surgical face masks amounting to RM870,780 were also delivered to frontliners at HKL, Hospital Sungai Buloh, Hospital Serdang, Hospital Sultanah Bahiyah in Kedah, Queen Elizabeth Hospital in Sabah and Hospital

A total of 54,650 face masks were also donated to those who required regular treatments and medical check-ups, such as dialysis patients, with 1,093 patients across the country benefiting from them.

YNP also kicked off its latest pro-

ject called Raise Against Hunger with a contribution of RM600,000 to provide daily meals for the B40 group who are badly affected by the outbreak.
