ABSTRACT

Recreational Activities is an outdoor activity that has attracted the attention of locals and general coverage in the mass media, especially in social media lately. However, the issue regard to recreational activities nowadays is many people are less doing recreational activities at this time. Therefore, this study will examine the relative importance of recreational activities and the level of satisfaction with the activities and facilities provided PMVCS. There are two objectives in this study: i) to identify the potential of recreational activities preferred by visitors at PMVCS, Kota Belud ii) to provide information on the most demanding recreational facilities at PMVCS. Kota Belud. The study of this research was an exploratory approach by applying quantitative methods as the main research method. Respondents of this study consist of 150 visitors at Polumpung Melangkap View Camp Site Kota Belud, Sabah. The data collection techniques used are questionnaire and indirect interview with the employers. The results show that there are some attraction factors that encourage respondents to do recreational activities, i.e. clear and cool river water, the beauty of the scenic view, the activities provided and the location. Furthermore, respondents' satisfaction levels on activities provided at PMVCS such as river bathing activities, photography activities, scenic view activities, picnic activities, and videography activities. In addition, the highest demand for facilities available at PMVCS is a camping facilities, water facilities and equipment for rent such as tents, cooking utensils, tables and more. In conclusion, this study is useful for the entrepreneurs in particular, as well as future researchers and as well as policy makers to ensure camping camp in Sabah especially in Kota Belud is more advanced and well-known at higher level.

ABSTRAK

Aktiviti Rekreasi adalah sebuah aktiviti rekreasi luar yang telah mendapat perhatian penduduk tempatan dan liputan meluas dalam media massa terutamanya di media sosial sejak akhir-akhir ini. Namun begitu, isu berkaitan dengan aktiviti rekreasi ini adalah masih ramai yang kurang melakukan aktivitiaktiviti rekreasi pada masa ini. Oleh itu, kajian ini akan meneliti berkaitan dengan satu tempat aktiviti rekreasi dariaspek faktor tarikan kunjungan dan tahap kepuasan terhadap aktiviti dan kemudahan yang disediakan. Terdapat 2 objektif dalam kajian ini, iaitu i) untuk mengenal pasti potensi aktiviti rekreasi yang diinginkan oleh pengunjung di PMVCS, Kota Belud ii) memberi maklumat mengenai kemudahan rekreasi yang paling tinggi permintaan di PMVCS, Kota Belud. Reka bentuk kajian yang digunakan ialah pendekatan penerokaan dengan mengaplikasikan kaedah kuantitatif sebagai kaedah penyelidikan yang utama. Responden kajian ini terdiri daripada 150 orang pengunjung di Polumpung Melangkap View Camp Site Kota Belud, Sabah. Teknik pengumpulan data yang digunakan adalah kaedah borang soal selidik dan temu bual tidak langsung bersama pihak pengusaha. Hasil kajian menunjukkan terdapat beberapa faktor tarikan yang mendorong responden untuk melakukan aktiviti rekreasi iaitu air sungai yang jernih dan sejuk, keindahan pemandangan sekitarnya, aktiviti yang ditawarkan dan kedudukan lokasi. Seterusnya, tahap kepuasan responden terhadap aktiviti yang disediakan di PMVCS seperti aktiviti bermandi sungai, aktiviti fotografi, aktiviti melihat pemandangan, aktiviti piknik, dan aktiviti videografi. Selain itu, permintaan tertinggi untuk kemudahan yang terdapat di PMVCS ialah kemudahan tempat berkhemah, kemudahan air dan kemudahan peralatan yang disewakan seperti khemah, peralatan memasak, meja dan lain-lain. Kesimpulannya, kajian ini adalah berguna kepada pihak pengusaha khususnya, juga kepada penyelidik masa akan datang serta kepada pembuat dasar untuk memastikan aktiviti rekreasi di Sabah khususnya di Kota Belud adalah lebih maju dan terkenal pada peringkat yang lebih tinggi.

CHAPTER 1

INTRODUCTION

1.1 An Overview of Recreation

Recreation is an essential part of human life and finds many different forms which are shaped naturally by individual interests but also by the surrounding social constructions. It can be defined as the activities that individual or groups carry during their leisure time. Recreational activities are often done for enjoyment, amusement, or pleasure and considered it to be 'fun'. The term recreation implies participation to be healthy, refreshing mind and body.

Nowadays, amount of public involving in recreation activities have increased because they bring a lot of benefits including physical and physiological. There are many factors that will influence someone to be involved in the recreational activity. One of the factor is because of economic background. They have more money spend for leisure time in their daily life to make some experiences and more satisfaction.

Word of recreation derived from the Latin word 'Recreare' which mean to refresh or to restore. This term is suitable with the benefit of doing some recreation activities which can refresh the body of individual after doing it. Recreation defined as activity that rest men from work often giving them change (distraction, diversion) and restores (recreates) them for work. According to Brockman and Merrian (1979), recreation can have many implications. It's involved any activity which is participated in, anytime, anywhere, merely for the enjoyment it effort.

Furthermore, recreation can be defined in term of human behavior. Firstly, it's is an experience that results from recreational engagement requires a commitment by the recreationist to develop a formal or informal course of action and self-rewarding. Moreover, recreation engagement requires the recreationist to make personal and free choices. Lastly, recreation engagement occur during non-obligated time is block of time during which we are bound by sense of urgency or importance to continue a given course of action such as work, civic activities and household chores.

1.2 Problem Statement

Camping tourism activity has begun to get the attention of the community and gained widespread coverage in the mass media in Malaysia, especially through social media lately. In Sabah, this activity is focus on various parties as the state has a beautiful natural treasure and is suitable as a camping site. For example, at Hounon Ridge Farmstay & Camping Kundasang which is on the view of Mount Kinabalu plus cool weather. While in Kota Belud, there is an increasingly trending campsite since 2017 until now at Polumpung Melangkap View Camp Site Kota Belud which is known for its view of Mount Kinabalu as well as the clear and cool water as the river's water sources originate from Mount Kinabalu. The proof is many visitors from within the country and abroad have preferred this location as their campsite.

The issues related to the PMVCS are the services they provide are still in a less satisfactory manner for visitors who come there. Ica Juwita Sambatan (Personal Communication, Director of PMVCS, 2018) mentioned that visitors are dissatisfied with the conditions facilities of bathrooms and toilets that available at PMVCS. Additionally, further study need to be conduct for the future planning of activities and facilities at PMVCS. In terms of research, this study is still new and rarely done in Malaysia generally and Sabah in particular. According to Faraheein (Personal Communication, May 31, 2018) issues related to this PMVCS have not been studied yet. So far, the documentation is only in the secondary sources of

social media and press reports. Therefore, less studies have been done in connection with this place. Other than that, to fulfill the requirements of the responsible service provider which are the criteria of high quality of the facilities, services and activities will ensure the high quality of recreational experience (Lepkova, 2013)

1.3 Objectives

Overall, the aim of this project is to study the Visitors' Preferences on Recreational Activities at Polumpung Melangkap View Campsite. The two sub-objectives in order to achieve the main objective which are:

- a. To identify potential recreational activities that preferred by the visitor at PMVCS, Kota Belud
- b. To provide information on the most demanding of recreational facilities at PMVCS, Kota Belud.

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
