

Sabah, UPM to develop dairy valley in Keningau

KOTA KINABALU: The Sabah government will collaborate with Universiti Putra Malaysia (UPM) to study, plan and develop a dairy valley in Keningau. In a discussion with the university on Thursday, Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Dr Jeffrey Kitingan proposed that the facility be built in Tambunan. "Currently, Tambunan's grazing reserve land covers a total of 9,150ha, not including Bingkor and Liawan within the Keningau municipality," he said here yesterday. Jeffrey, who is also Sabah Agriculture and Food Industry Minister, said the dairy valley would be supported by several satellite farms to be developed on grazing reserve land nearby. However, the meeting did not set any deadline for the report on the study.
