travel to the venue for partic-

ipants residing outside KL,

Selangor and Putrajaya.

Selected applicants – irrespective of their acceptance to the programme – will be considered for a range of continued learning and internship opportunities to participate in the EU's public diplomacy in Asean and in Malaysia.
 The summit serves as a simulation to showcase the

differences and collaborative

Asean as strategic partners in

efforts between the EU and

tackling pressing global challenges.

> Youths will be given the opportunities to meet and network with national and regional representatives, along with the movers and shakers of EU-Asean relations, gain first-hand experience

and a deeper understanding

of diplomacy areas and diplo-

matic processes between the EU and Asean, and develop practical skills in leadership, teamwork, negotiation, critical thinking, and research under real-world pressure.

> To apply, submit an essay (no more than 1,000 words) in English on one of two topics – "The World We Want" or "EU Molecule Paletione".
